For epic views and modern Asian cooking: Merois

Some weekends call for proper pampering and the place to be is Merois at the Pendry hotel in West Hollywood. Whether seated outdoors near the pool or in the sumptuously appointed dining room, there's no bad seat in the house. Wolfgang Puck's winding menu has something for everyone and dessert is definitely in order. Start with a few skewers grilled over binchotan, the Spanish octopus and beef skewers are both appealing for a surf and turf experience. Nearly every table orders the sizzling whole fish with a pineapple glaze or the tremendous Shanghai lobster with crispy spinach and rice. 51 rooftop restaurants and bars in L.A. to soak in the best city views

Merois

On the 11th floor of the Pendry Hotel is a Californian Art Deco haven. Merois is Wolfgang Puck's fourth restaurant in West Hollywood and sits on the uppermost floor of the Pendry Hotel. From the colorful, seashell-shaped booths to the bird of paradise plants lining the walls, Merois' design is immediately captivating. There are two dining areas: One faces the hotel pool by the bar and bleeds around the corner into the indoor dining area. From here, you can catch a glimpse of the Hollywood Hills in between high-rise buildings. In the indoor dining room, the closer to the windows you are, the better views you have looking southeast to downtown L.A. and southwest to Baldwin Hills. It does get quite dark in the enclosed dining room once the sun goes down, but the booths make for an intimate retreat as you gaze out through the south-facing windows. Puck's menu marries pan-Asian influences with California seasonality, including a raw bar with crispy rice and tuna tartare and a selection of dim sum with a standout fried lobster spring roll.

Though other <u>WeHo hotel restaurants</u> might possess a similar winning combination of ritzy, ultra-chic interior design and breathtaking urban vistas (plus the glitzy patrons to match), only Wolfgang Puck's newest fine-dining endeavor strives to do more than just coast on its looks. Pairing aesthetics with actual substance, Merois demonstrates that later works in a longtime celebrity chef's oeuvre, even one as expansive and commercialized as Puck's, can still delight and outright impress seasoned diners. French Californian dishes with plenty of Asian culinary influences, all atop the Pendry's rooftop? Sounds like a date to us.
